

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
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➤ WHAT IS COMPUTER NETWORK? (1 OR 2 M)

DETAIL

- Network is a group of computers.
- It connected to each other.
- Using network we can share resources and services.
- The shared resource can be data, a printer, a fax modem, or a service such as a database or an email system.
- The individual systems must be connected through a pathway (called the transmission medium) that is used to transmit the resource or service between the computers.
- All systems in the network must follow a set of common communication rules for datatransmission.
- These set of common rules for data communication are known as protocols.



Advantages of Networking:

- The goal of computer networking is simply to exchange data..
- It reduces time and cost.
- Networking is to provide different services like... filing services, printing services etc...

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

- Client server means all computer connect to one central computer.

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


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- This central computer is called server.

EXPLAIN TYPES OF COMPUTER NETWORK. (2 OR 3 M)



- Networks come in different shapes and sizes. According to geographical size network
 - → basically classify in following three types.
 - 1) LAN Local Area Networks
 - 2) MAN Metropolitan Area Networks
 - 3) WAN Wide Area Networks
- a. Local Area Networks (LANs)
 - A Local Area Network (LAN) is a group of computers and network

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communication devices.

- It interconnected within a geographically limited area, such as a building or a campus.
- They transfer data at high speeds (higher bandwidth).
- They exist in a limited geographical area.
- LANs are designed to allow resources to be shared between personal computers or workstations.

b. Metropolitan Area Networks (MANs)

- MAN is a connected network that spans the geographic boundaries of a city.
- By interconnecting smaller networks within a large geographic area, information is easily sent throughout the network.
- Local libraries and government agencies often use a MAN to connect to citizens and private industries.
- Examples of MAN are Cable TV network, Cable through Internet service.

c. Wide Area Networks (WANs)

- A Wide Area Network (WAN) provides long-distance transmission of data, voice, image and video information over large geographical areas that may comprise acountry or whole world.
- They exist in an unlimited geographical area.
- They usually interconnect multiple LANs.
- They often transfer data at lower speeds (lower bandwidth).

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

EXPLAIN NETWORK TOPOLOGY. (5M)(MIMP)




- The network topology defines the way in which computers, printers, and other devices are connected.
- A network topology describes the layout of the wire and devices as well as the paths used by data transmissions.
- Topology means design.

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2. Bus Topology:

- All devices are connected to a central cable, called the bus or backbone.
- Bus networks are relatively inexpensive and easy to install for small networks.
- In Simple way we can say us (All devices share a common wire to transmit and receive data.)

Advantages:

- It is easy to handle and implement.
- It is best suited for small networks

Disadvantages:

- The cable length is limited. This limits the number of stations that can be connected.
- This network topology can perform well only for a limited number of nodes.

3. Ring topology:

- All devices are connected to one another in the shape of a closed loop.
- Here each device is connected directly to two other devices, one on either side of it.
- Ring topologies are expensive and difficult to install, but they offer high bandwidth and can span large distances.

Advantages:

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- The data being transmitted between two nodes passes through all the intermediate nodes.
- A central server is not required for the management of this topology.

Disadvantages:

The failure of a single node of the network can cause the entire network to fail.

4. Star topology:

- In star topology each device in the network is connected to a central device called hub.
- Unlike Mesh topology, star topology doesn't allow communication between devices, a device must have to communicate through hub.
- If one device wants to send data to other device, it has to first send the data to hub andthen the hub transmit that data to the designated device.

Advantages:

- Less expensive because each device only need one I/O port and needs to be connected withhub with one link.
- Easier to install.
- Less amount of cables required

Disadvantages:

If hub goes down everything goes down, none of the devices can work without hub.

5. Tree topology:

- Tree topologies have a root node, and all other nodes are connected which form ahierarchy. So it is also known as hierarchical topology.
- Used in Wide Area Network.
- A tree topology includes multiple star topologies.

Advantages:

- Failure of one node never affects the rest of the network.
- Detection of error is an easy process

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Disadvantages:

- It is heavily cabled topology
- If more nodes are added, then its maintenance is difficult

6. Mesh Topology:

- The mesh topology connects all devices (nodes) to each other.
- It is used in WANs to interconnect LANs and for mission critical networks like those used by banks and financial institutions.
- Implementing the mesh topology is expensive and difficult.

Advantage:

The arrangement of the network nodes is such that it is possible to transmit datafrom one node to many other nodes at the same time.

Disadvantage:

The arrangement wherein every network node is connected to every other node of the network, many of the connections serve no major purpose.

7. Hybrid Topology:

- Hybrid topology connect two or more topology that's why it is called hybrid.
- This combination of topologies is done according to the requirements of the organization.



TRICKTO REMEMBER SEVEN LAYERS OF OSI

- International standard organization (ISO) established a committee in 1977 to develop architecture for computer communication.
- Open Systems Interconnection (OSI) reference model is the result of this effort.
- In 1984, the Open Systems Interconnection (OSI) reference model was approved as an international standard for communications architecture.
- The OSI model is now considered the primary Architectural model for client server model.
- The OSI model describes how data is travel from one computer to other computer.(client to server, server to client).
- It is provide 7 layer to manage all data transmission.

1. Physical Layer:

- Provides physical interface for transmission of information.
- Defines rules by which bits are passed from one system to another on a physical communication medium.
- Such characteristics as voltage levels, timing of voltage changes, physical data rates, maximum transmission distances, physical connectors, and other similar attributes are defined by physical layer specifications.

2. Data Link Layer:

- Data link layer attempts to provide reliable communication over the physical layer interface.
- Breaks the outgoing data into frames and reassemble the received frames.
- Implement flow control.

3. Network Layer:

- It provide address means path where data to be travel.
- It provide easy path than data can travel fast and accurate.
- Defines logical addressing so that any endpoint can be identified.

4. Transport Layer:

- it travel data from one address to other.
- Main purpose is data can transfer error free.

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- Ensures that data units are delivered in sequence.
- Ensures that there is no loss or duplication of data units.

5. Session Layer:

- It control all the data transmission.
- Any necessary log-on or password validation is also handled by this layer.
- Session layer is also responsible for terminating the connection.

6. Presentation Layer:

Presentation layer defines the format in which the data is to be exchanged between the two communicating entities.

7. Application Layer:

- Application layer interacts with application programs and is the highest level of OSI model.
- Examples of application layer are applications such as file transfer, electronic mail, remotelogin etc.

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

EXPLAIN TCP/IP (1/2/3 M)



- TCP/IP model, designed and developed by Department of Defence (DoD) in 1960s and is based on standard protocols.
- It stands for Transmission Control Protocol/Internet Protocol.
- The TCP/IP model is a **Short(new)** version of the OSI model.
- It contains four layers, unlike seven layers in the OSI model. The layers are:
 - 1. Process/Application Layer
 - 2. Host-to-Host/Transport Layer
 - 3. Internet Layer
 - 4. Network Access/Link Layer
- TCP/IP, or the Transmission Control Protocol/Internet Protocol, is a suite of communication protocols used to interconnect network devices on the internet.

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- Three of the most common TCP/IP protocols
 - **HTTP**
 - **HTTPS**
 - FTP
- ➤ Different layers of TCP/IP
 - 1. Network Access Layer This layer is related to building packets.
 - 2. Internet Layer This layer uses IP (Internet Protocol) to describe how packets are tobe delivered.
 - 3. Application Layer This layer deals with application network processes.
 - These processes include FTP (File Transfer Protocol), HTTP (Hypertext Transfer Protocol), and SMTP (Simple Mail Transfer Protocol).



- ISP: ISP is An Internet Service Provider (ISP) is an organization that provides dial-in Internet account.
- Choosing an ISP: We should consider following features before choosing any ISP.

> Features of ISP:

- **Local phone number**: Most of ISPs have many phone numbers that your computer can call to connect to the Internet. By having a local phone number you don't need to spend more on long-distance charges for Internet connection.
- **Price**: ISPs generally charge for the hours or speed they provide. So, you can select your ISP by calculating your usage or speed required.
- **Software**: Some ISPs provide a CD-ROM or disk with software that you can use to connect to and use the Internet.
- **Support**: You never know when you're going to have a problem, so your ISP's technical support phone number (and e-mail help desk) should be open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- **Speed:** Some ISPs have local access numbers that work with 28.8 Kbps, 33.6 Kbps, and 56 Kbps modems. Some also support highspeed connections such as ISDN and ADSL at extra cost.

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
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- A URL identifies a particular Internet resource; for example, a web page.

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

- Typical services offered by portal sites include a directory of Web sites, a facility to search for other sites, news, weather information, e-mail, stock quotes, phone and map information, and sometimes a community forum. Excite is among the first portals to offer users the ability to create a site that is personalized for individual interests.

- The Domain Name System (DNS) is the phonebook of the Internet.
- Humans access information online through domain names, like nytimes.com or espn.com.
- Web browsers interact through Internet Protocol (IP) addresses.
- DNS translates domain names to IP addresses so browsers can load Internet resources.
- Each device connected to the Internet has a unique IP address which other machines use to find the device.
- DNS servers eliminate the need for humans to memorize IP addresses such as 192.168.1.1 (inIPv4), more complex alphanumeric or newer IΡ addresses.



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

- Remote access is also known as remote login. To establish a remote connection, both the local machine and the remote computer/server must

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

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



DETAIL

1. E-COMMERCE

- E-commerce is the buying and selling of products and services by businesses and consumers over the Internet.
- People use the term "ecommerce" to describe encrypted payments on the Internet.
- Benefits of E-Commerce:
 - o Reduced costs by reducing labor, reduced paper work, reduced errors in keying in data, reduce post costs.
 - o Reduced time. Shorter lead times for payment and return on investment inadvertising, faster delivery of product
 - o Improve relationships with trading partners.

2. E-BUSINESS

- E-business (electronic business), derived from such terms as "e-mail" and "e- commerce," is the conduct of business on the Internet, not only buying and selling but also servicing customers collaborating with business partners.
- For example, a successful shop front business may decide to create a website to promote their business but not actually sell products directly through the internet.

3. M-COMMERCE

The phrase mobile commerce was originally coined in 1997 by Kevin

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Duffey at the launch of the Global Mobile Commerce Forum, to mean "the delivery of electronic commerce capabilities consumer's anywhere, via wireless into the hand, technology."

- Many choose to think of Mobile Commerce as meaning "a retail outlet in your customer's pocket."
- M-commerce (mobile commerce) is the buying and selling of goods and services through wireless handheld devices such as cellular telephone and personal digital assistants (PDAs).
- Known as next-generation e-commerce, m-commerce enables users to access the Internet without needing to find a place to plug in.

- E-commerce transactions are limited. E-business transactions are not limited.
- M-commerce is a sub-part of e-commerce



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

- ☐ Web hosts can also provide data center space and connectivity to the Internet for other servers located in their data center, called colocation, also known as *Housing* in Latin America or France.

- A web page or webpage is a document commonly written in HyperText Markup Language (HTML) that is accessible through the Internet or other network using an Internet browser.
- A web page is accessed by entering a URL address and may contain text, graphics, and hyperlinks to other web pages and files.

Static v Dynamic Website Design

- There are basically two main types of website static and dynamic.
- A static site is one that is usually written in plain HTML and what is in the code of the page is what is displayed to the user.
- A dynamic site is one that is written using a server-side scripting language such as PHP, ASP, JSP, or ColdFusion.
- In such a site the content is called in by the scripting language from other files or from a database depending on actions taken by the user.

Static sites - advantages

- Flexibility is the main advantage of a static site every page can be different if desired, to match the layout to different content, and the designer is free to put in any special effects that a client may ask for in a unique way on different pages.
- This allows theming for instance an author may want a different theme for a different book and associated pages or perhaps for a series of books, in order to match the cover designs or the context of the stories.
- Cost is generally lower up-front than a dynamic site.

Static sites - disadvantages

• The main problem with any static site appears when you wish to update the content. Unless you are conversant with HTML and the design methods used in the site then you have to go back to the designer to have

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any content changes made.

Dynamic sites - advantages

- The main advantages of dynamic sites are that by connecting them to databases you can easily pull in information in an organized and structured way to create product pages or categories of related products sorted in a variety of different ways depending on how the user wants to view them.
- This ability to connect to a database means that you can also create a content management system - an interface which allows the client to input and manage data via a web-based series of administration pages.

Responsive Website:-

Responsive web design (RWD) is an approach to web design aimed at crafting sites to provide an optimal viewing and interaction experience—easy reading and navigation with a minimum of resizing, panning, and scrolling across a wide range of devices (from desktop computer monitors to mobile phones).

EXPLAIN NETWORK SECURITY CONCEPTS (3M EACH)

DETAIL

1. Cyber Law:-

- Cyber law or Internet law is a term that encapsulates the legal issues related to use of the Internet.
- It is less a distinct field of law than intellectual property or contract law, as it is a domain covering many areas of law and regulation.
- Some leading topics include internet access and usage, privacy, freedom of expression, and jurisdiction.

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- "Computer law" is a third term which tends to relate to issues including both Internet law and the patent and copyright aspects of computer technology and software.
- There are rules on the uses to which computers and computer networks may be put, in particular there are rules on unauthorized access, data privacy and spamming.
- There are also limits on the use of encryption and of equipment which may be used to defeat copy protection schemes. The export of hardware and software between certain states within the United States is also controlled.

2. Firewall: -

- In computing, a firewall is a network security system that monitors and controls the incoming and outgoing network traffic based on predetermined security rules.
- A firewall typically establishes a barrier between a trusted, secure internal network and another outside network, such as the Internet, that is assumed not to be secure or trusted.
- Firewalls are often categorized as either network firewalls or host-based firewalls. Network firewalls are a software appliance running on general purpose hardware or hardware-based firewall computer appliances that filter traffic between two or more networks.
- Host-based firewalls provide a layer of software on one host that controls network traffic in and out of that single machine.
- Firewall appliances may also offer other functionality to the internal network they protect such as acting as a DHCP or VPN server for that network.

3. Cookies: -

- An HTTP cookie (also called web cookie, Internet cookie, browser cookie or simply cookie) is a small piece of data sent from a website and stored in the user's web browser while the user is browsing.
- They can also be used to remember arbitrary pieces of information that the

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user previously entered into form fields such as names, addresses, passwords, and credit card numbers.

- Other kinds of cookies perform essential functions in the modern web. Perhaps most importantly, authentication cookies are the most common method used by web servers to know whether the user is logged in or not, and which account they are logged in with.
- Without such a mechanism, the site would not know whether to send a page containing sensitive information, or require the user to authenticate them by logging in.

4. Hackers and Crackers:-

- A cracker (also known as a black hat hacker) is an individual with extensive computer knowledge whose purpose is to breach or bypass internet security or gain access to software without paying royalties.
- The general view is that, while hackers build things, crackers break things. Cracker is the name given to hackers who break into computers for criminal gain; whereas, hackers can also be internet security experts hired to find vulnerabilities in systems.
- These hackers are also known as white hat hackers. Crackers' motivations can range from profit, a cause they believe in, general maliciousness or just because they like the challenge.
- They may steal credit card numbers, leave viruses, destroy files or collect personal information to sell.
- Crackers can also refer to those who reverse engineer software and modify it for their own amusement.
- The most common way crackers gain access to networks or systems is through social engineering, whereby the cracker contacts employees at a company and tricks them into divulging passwords and other information that allows a cracker to gain access.

DETAIL

1. Electronic Cheque: -

- An electronic cheque is an electronic copy (scanned image) of a real cheque, which is then transferred by email. In addition to the cheque's 'real' signature, the transfer must be digitally signed using the sender's private key to authenticate the transfer.
- Electronic checks have been developed in response to the transactions that have arisen in the world of electronic commerce. Electronic checks can be used to make a payment for any transaction that a paper check can cover and are governed by the same laws that apply to paper checks.

2. Smart Card: -

• A smart card, chip card, or integrated circuit card (ICC) is any pocket-sized

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card that has embedded integrated circuits.

- Smart cards are made of plastic, generally polyvinyl chloride, but sometimes polyethylene terephthalate based polyesters, acrylonitrile butadiene styrene or polycarbonate.
- Since April 2009, a Japanese company has manufactured reusable financial smart cardsmade from paper.
- Smart cards can be either contact or contactless smart card. Smart cards can provide personal identification, authentication, data storage, and application processing.
- Smart cards may provide strong security authentication for single sign-on (SSO) within largeorganizations.

3. Debit / Credit Card: -

- Debit and credit cards offer more than a way to access money without having to carry around cash or a bulky checkbook.
- **Debit cards** are like digitized versions of checkbooks; they are linked to your bank account (usually achecking account), and money is debited (withdrawn) from the account as soon as the transaction occurs.
- Credit cards are different; they offer a line of credit (i.e., a loan) that is interest-free if the monthly credit card bill is paid on time. Instead of being connected to a personal bank account, a credit card is connected to the bank or financial institution that issued the card. So when you use a credit card, the issuer pays the merchant and you go into debt to the card issuer.
